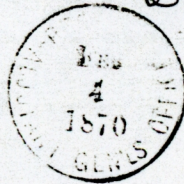

Sir.

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 1501605, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls of your Office, that Emanuel Hartman was enrolled on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1861, at St Paul in Co. the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Minn Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Pvt on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1864, at St Paul Minn, in Co. the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Minn Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "G" of that Regiment, for the months of Nov & Dec 1864, he is reported "Absent without leave in Minn. since Dec 27, 64, supposed to be dead." Muster Roll of Co. dated Sept 2, 65 reports him "Died in Chickasaw Co. Iowa Oct 8, 64, while on furlough."
