and served in the Regiment No. 3

under the Command of Col. Eliz. Butler

of the Pennsylvania Line, and that he continued in the service until the war ended.

I further declare that I have never received a warrant for the Bounty Land promised to said Philip Klinger in the part of the United States; nor do I believe that he ever received it, or transferred his claim to another in manner whatsoever; therefore know all men by these presents, that I Peter Klinger aforesaid do hereby

constitute and appoint Vespasian Ellis of Accomack County beginning to be my true and lawful Attorney for me and in my name to demand and receive from the Secretary of War of the United States a warrant for the quantity of land due to me as aforesaid; and my said attorney is hereby fully authorised and empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes or attorneys under him for the special purpose above expressed.
