

Birthday Party Planned

DALEVILLE — Representatives of Daleville service clubs and businesses agreed Tuesday night to hold a birthday party for the town this fall.

Aug. 20 was set as the tentative date for the first anniversary celebration, pending town board approval.

On Aug. 19, 1982, the town was legally incorporated.

Seven Salem Township Volunteer firemen, ambulance crew and auxiliary members came up with the idea for the party. They notified more than 30 clubs and 57 businesses in town of Tuesday's meeting, according to committee member Jim Ballentine.

"We got positive feedback from nearly everyone who was contacted," said Ballentine.

He suggested to the group that they start with

a small celebration.

"If you have a successful base then you can go on next year," he said.

Ideas for the celebration include a parade, a block party with an ice-cream and cake social and renting booth space to craft and food vendors. A nine-member committee volunteered to coordinate the celebration. They plan to meet March 5 and report back with ideas at another general meeting. The tentative date for that meeting is 7 p.m. March 23.

Ballentine urged those attending to have special money raising projects in their organizations to help fund the party. Auxiliary member Shirley Lewis said her group hoped to raise enough money from the celebration to donate money to the town for purchase of Christmas lights.

At least thirteen booths, a softball tournament, a 10 kilometer run and a parade are scheduled for the August 20 Daleville Birthday Celebration. The town's first anniversary will be celebrated in a day-long festival on Daleville School grounds.

At a June 20 meeting, celebration committee chairman Jim Ballentine announced \$224 has been received from donations and booth rentals toward festival expenses. "We are almost in range of paying the insurance. This won't pay any other expenses," he said. An insurance policy costing nearly \$250 must be in force before festival date. Ballentine urged committee members to contact local businesses for both cash donations and auction articles.

July 15 is final registration date for booth space, parade units and other activities. Committee member JoAnn Anderson said, "Everybody thinks there is still lots of time to decide, but there are only six weeks left before the festival." Several groups had previously indicated to committee members they would "probably participate". Persons or groups wishing to register for booths or activities should contact Nancy Limbert, 378-7384.

The group set noon as starting time for the Saturday parade. Interested groups are persons should contact Claudia Davis, 354-2090.

Ballentine told committee members to start looking for another chairman. He said he must resign because of an 80-90 hours per week work load at his Daleville Engineering firm. "The framework is pretty much laid. Someone just needs to carry through, now," he said.

DALEVILLE — Thirteen booths, a softball tournament, a 10-kilometer run and a parade are on tap for the Aug. 20 Daleville birthday celebration.

The town's first anniversary will be celebrated in a day-long festival on the Daleville school grounds.

At a meeting Thursday, celebration committee chairman Jim Ballentine announced \$224 has been received from donations and booth rental.

"We are almost in range of paying the insurance," he said. "This won't pay any other expenses."

He urged committee members to contact local businesses for both cash donations and auction articles. An insurance premium of \$250 must be paid before the celebration.
