

# RED MEN END MEET; INDORSE PROGRAM OF "AMERICANISM"

Indianapolis, Sept. 15 (AP)—The Improved Order of Red Men, with 187,000 members in thirty-six states, ended its eighty-eighth convention here tonight pledged to an "Americanism" program to combat propaganda of alien political and economic philosophies.

The convention adopted resolutions today commending democracy and condemning foreign "isms" as intended to destroy liberty. It proposed that the United States take in refugees from political and religious persecution on condition they be able to support themselves and become citizens as soon as possible.

The Red Men pledged themselves to help educate aliens toward their gaining United States citizenship.

The national organization will meet in 1940 in Columbus, O., the convention decided.

Edgar C. Levey of San Francisco Cal., installed as Great Inchoonee tonight, appointed George M. Smith of San Jose, Cal., Great Tocakon; Samuel D. Stiles of Denver, Col., Great Minewa, and A. H. Woehning of Minneapolis great guard of forest.

National leaders will hold a post-convention conference tomorrow.
