FOUND BY CHILDREN

The body of A. (Pete) Foulke, 44, Arcadia garage man, was discovered on the rear porch of his home, Wednesday evening by two little girls, who had gone to the Foulke home to play with the man's little daughter. The frightened children ran from the horrible spectacle and summoned aid. Dr. E. V. Shockey and W. C. Ogle, who reached the scene in a short time, found that death had occurred some time prior, the physician expressing the opinion the man had been dead for two hours.

POLICE CAPTURE LAST SUSPECT

The unfortunate man had used the right barrel of a double barrel gun to commit the deed and the entire top of the head was blown away by the discharge. A portion of the skull was found some distance from the body, which was a horrible sight. The body was found on the back porch.

HE ADMITS SHOOTING

The only explanation for the suicide is financial worries he, having complained to friends about the slow business. Mr. Foulke was the senior partner in the Foulke & Long garage of Arcadia and had been in business in that town for a number of years.

Indianapolis, June 7. — Receipts on hogs, 5,000; cattle, 700; calves, 300; lambs, 1,000. Hog prices early today in the local live stock market were 10c to 20c higher, with the top, \$3.50, for best selections; pigs and light weights, 190 to 150 pounds, sold at \$1.50 to \$2.75; 160 to 200 pounds, at \$2.25 to \$3.55; 200 to 300 pounds from \$2.50 to \$2.75; over 300 pounds at \$3.50 to \$3.55; sows at \$2.25 to \$2.55.

Cattle were steady to a shade higher, calves were steady at \$5 down, and lambs were steady at \$9.00 down.
