I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 150, 603, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls of the ~~Adjutant General's Office~~ that Emanuel Hartman was enrolled on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1861, at St Paul in Co. the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Minn Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Pvt on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1861, at St Paul Minn, in Co. the, 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Minn Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Mustered Roll of Co. "G" of that Regiment, for the months of Nov & Dec 1861, he is reported "Absent without leave in Minnesota Dec 22, 64, suspended till dead." The Roll of Co. dated Sept 12, 65 report him "Died in Chickasaw Co. Iowa Oct 8, 64, while on furlough."
