Nicholas Ikess 1790 PA Census – Chester Co, PA
1 adult male, 1 male under 16 and 3 females

Johann Nicholas Ickes – B 1714, Germany

- Wife: Anna Clara – d 11 July 1765
- 2 sons
 - Michael – Father of Nicholas w/ 20 kids
 - John
- Source: Probate Records in File 153 in the Philadelphia City Records (Will: Book N page 292)

Nicholas Ickes [see list 4 above] moved to Perry Co about the same time as Philip Klinger moved from the 1800 Census records.

- Bought land in Pikeland from Hench – Sold out and moved to Perry Co – 2 wives, 20 kids – Founded Ickesburg, PA.
- A book *family record of the ickes family* by susan a ickes harding, 1892 adequately covers this man.

Limerick Twp (Montgomery Co, Pennsylvania) Then Philadelphia County

- 4 brothers and 3 sisters came to America from Germany in September 1738 in 2 ships with their widowed mother
- Johan Nicholas Ickes – purchased land in Limerick Twp in 1745
- Other brothers: Johannes, Peter, Georg Henry

York County Historical Society (Pennsylvania) has in their deed files

- 2 L p. 221, Aug 24 1795

- Catherine Klinger of Huntington Twp to her sister Elizabeth Ickes in Augusta Co., Virginia
 - § *Absolutely without any manner of consideration all of my whole estate that I am now processt (sic) of onle my funeral expenses being paid first: . . .*

29 July 1759: Anna Barbara Ickes, daughter of George Henry Ickes: St Mathew's Lutheran in Hanover (now Montgomery Co, PA), G.T. Bahn, p 44 Sp: Jacob Wolfe and wife Anna Barbara

- York County [Pennsylvania] – her possible siblings:
 - Ickes, Heinrich & Anna Elizabeth, parents of:
 - Johan Michael bp 17 Nov 1761; sp Michael Ickes & anna Maria Wagnerin
 - Sussanna Maria bp 15 Jan 1764 sp Frederick Berling & Sussanna Wagnerin
 - Maria Chrisina bp 23 Mar 1768
- “York County is plausible to be the county of Barbara’s childhood and where the couple would have met since I believe Philip probably spent the later part of the war in York Co with General Clark, and this is where he was when he was discharged. Also, if his unmarried sister, Catherine, lived in York County, she may have come to live near her brother.”
